

Matthew 16:21-28

DFH Worship Translation

²¹ From that time Jesus began to make known to his disciples that it is necessary for him to go away to Jerusalem, to suffer much from the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be killed and on the third day to be raised.

²² Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, “May [God] be gracious to you, Lord. It certainly will not happen to you.”

²³ And he turned around and said to Peter, “Go away behind me, Satan; you [are] a stumbling block to me, because you are not setting your mind on the things of God but the things of men.”

²⁴ Then Jesus said to his disciples, “If someone wishes to come behind me, let him disregard himself, take up his cross and follow me.

²⁵ For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life on account of me will find it.

²⁶ For what will a man be benefitted if he gains the whole world but forfeits his life? Or what will a man give in exchange for his life?

²⁷ For the Son of Man is about to come in the glory of his father with his angels, and then he will give out to each according to his practice.

²⁸ Amen, I say to you that there are some who have been standing here who certainly will not taste death until they behold the Son of Man coming in his kingdom.”
